Emptying dog-waste bins	Diseases, infections and blindness. Cuts & infections	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strong gloves to be worn at all times. • Black sacks to be placed in dog-waste bins to minimise direct physical handling of waste. • Do not place hands in bin. • Place removed full black sack inside another sack before removal from site. • Take care to ensure black sack is not pierced. • Ensure removed full black sack is replaced by another one immediately. • Dog-waste bins should be emptied weekly (top bin), and fortnightly (bottom bin). • Volunteers must wash hands on completion of task 	Thoroughly wash any cuts or abrasions as soon as possible, however minor. Seek medical attention where appropriate.	2 x 5 = 10	L
